While we encourage you to read as much as possible, Students with 5 or more will receive a special treat when the school year begins.

Pre K-2

Some ideas for Summer Reading:

- -Make it fun! Read at the beach, under a tree, snuggled on the couch
- -Read loved books over and over
- -Visit the Haverhill Public Library and let your child borrow books that interest them
- -On the HPS Launchpad under Classlink, your child should be able to access Learning A-Z for online books
- -Ask your child questions about the books you've read together:
 - What do you think will happen next?
 - How do you think the character is feeling? How can you tell?
 - Does this story remind you of anything?
 - What did you learn in this book?
 - Did you like this book? Why or why not?

Practice writing: (Pictures and words)

- Let them make a grocery list for you
- Draw a picture of the favorite part of a book that you have read together and have them tell you all about it
- Keep a summer journal of all the things they do
- Draw/write a letter to a friend or someone they miss
- Let them write their own story and read it to you
